FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

In the 2015-2016 school-year Sunridge Middle School students continued to demonstrate growth in both academic and social/emotional areas.

Students at Sunridge taking the Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBAC) produced scores similar to students in middle level grades across the state of Oregon in both language arts and mathematics. At the same time, Sunridge students scored higher in science as compared to peers across the state of Oregon. Data received from both the Smarter Balanced Assessment and locally generated classroom assessments help our teachers make informed decisions regarding instruction for both large students groups and individual student needs.

Sunridge students needing additional help in language arts or mathematics are given intervention classes strategically added to their daily schedule. Intervention classes focus on providing students with additional access to curriculum that includes increased practice and adult help and support. Additionally, Sunridge has a number of plus or advanced classes aimed at challenging high-performing students in multiple subjects. We encourage parental involvement by volunteering, attending open houses and conferences, and participating in the Sunridge Middle School Parent Club.


