



Course Descriptions

Some flexibility of design is built into many of the projects, but focus will be on understanding each tool, and its specific function. Additionally, students will complete tasks that are designed to give back to our school and greater communities.





Advanced Woodshop

Students must take Beginning Woodshop to take this course. It will require more design input from the students and be project based. Students will create a few required projects for themselves, the school, and our community, before selecting a final project, specific to them.
